Birds canker virus

Over the past three weeks I have taken to Totnes Birdcare and Exmouth Wildcare for urgent treatment 6 house sparrows, 5 goldfinches, 2 greenfinches, 1 collared dove, 1 woodpigeon and 1 bluetit. These birds had a very nasty, and even lethal when untreated, canker virus. Since it's such a high number of birds I was asked if I could relay a message to the people of Blackawton to be on the look-out for birds who are grounded or seem a bit unwell.

If you find one you can take it to Dart Vale vets for treatment, from there they will likely be handed over to the RSPCA or other wildlife rescue organisations. Or you can contact Totnes Birdcare and Exmouth Wildcare on 07812 833996 or 867574. You can help to limit the numbers of birds affected by disinfecting bird feeders every time you change the food. For a little while at least, it is advisable to remove all food from bird feeders, disinfect them in something like Dettol, and not feed the birds at all for a few weeks. This is to get them to disperse, to significantly lower the chance of infection to currently healthy birds.

This voluntary group, People to People Solidarity Taunton Deane Life Raft, was established last August by Frederica Smith, a Lib Dem councillor in the town. She quickly realised that her garage was too small to use as a collection point for donated clothes and bedding. Frederica is highly motivated, passionate and persuasive so it wasn't long before the council offered the use of a redundant auction room to act as the hub. What a hub it is! This is a large building running like clockwork and manned by a team of cheerful, welcoming volunteers. The centre has teamed up with other like-minded groups across the country, sharing information, transport and resources. Nothing is wasted. The demand continues to be for basic items: pulses, rice, tinned fruit, tinned vegetables, spices, tinned fish (rather than meat).

Village Hall

What do you want from your Village Hall?

You are probably aware that there are plans to extend the Village Hall to accommodate the Community Shop. This development (subject to planning permission) will create a two-storey extension to the Village Hall with the shop on the top floor, accessed from the level of the existing shop, and a room or rooms on the same level as the existing Village Hall. The management committee want your views on what you want from your Village Hall, now and in the future.

Please let us know by completing the questionnaire at the back of this Beacon. It's **your Village Hall**, and we need to know what you want, so please take a little time to fill in the questionnaire and return it to us.

Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

Booking the Village Hall

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. We now have a Facebook page; I'm not very familiar with Facebook yet so it may take a while for things to appear correctly. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

- Enter http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81 in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.
- 2. Via Facebook (www.facebook.com); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<< Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 1st March 2016

Notes only; for detail please contact the Parish Clerk.

Cllrs Rake (Chairman), Mallyon, Joyce, Coe, Perry and Lewis-Davis were present as were Cllr Hicks (SHDC), Cllr Hawkins (DCC), Annette Thom (acting Clerk), and one member of the public. Apologies were received from Cllr Wills.

Chairman's resignation

Cllr Mallyon resigned as Chairman in view of his several months of absence in order to facilitate continuity for BPC. He was thanked by the member of the public present for his work as Chairman. Cllr Rake's proposal for a vote of thanks to Cllr Mallyon for his work for the Council and for his handling of the Town Farm application was carried unanimously.

Hedge flailing

A member of the public presented a pamphlet discussing the importance of hedges as habitat and their potential as a cash crop. It was agreed that the pamphlet would be posted on the Community Website and passed on to local high schools as a potential journalism article subject.

Reports from County and District Councillors

Cllr Hawkins reported on a forthcoming meeting regarding maintenance of the Slapton Line. Cllr Hawkins and Dr Wollaston MP met with the Principal of Dartmouth Academy recently. Thirty new pupils have enrolled with the School since the last Ofsted Report's publication. He noted the support from Kingsbridge Community College and from Dartmouth Academy students. The Community Budget has £750 available for Parish projects. The funds must be spent by December 2016.

Cllr Hicks reported that SHDC is struggling to write a Local Development Plan because of the workload of responding to consultations from central Government. He has £700 grant funding per year available to Blackawton. Funds can be carried forward for the first three years of his term and no 2015/16 grant has been made yet.

agricultural building. The applicant described the application. It was resolved to

support the application.

O091/16/OPA The Dartmouth Golf, Hotel & Spa Blackawton Devon TQ9 7DE. Outline application with some matters reserved proposed extension to hotel accommodation including

ancillary and office accommodation, landscaping and parking facilities and repositioned golf buggy store. **Supported.**

Application to designate a Neighbourhood Plan area for Kingswear. The area is the same as the Parish boundary.

Consultations:

- South Hams and West Devon Playing Pitch Strategy, closes 29 February 2016. Cllrs Joyce and Mallyon will respond on behalf of BPC.
- South Hams Green Infrastructure Framework, closes 25 March 2016.

Hard copies of current planning applications are available to Councillors and to members of the public in The George Inn.

Finance

No February bank statement had been received at the time of the meeting. Allowing for payments to be made and earmarked reserves of £29,408.26, and assuming the payment of £2,232 for the community bus to the Ivy Lane Centre a balance of £5,722.98 remained. A cheque for fifty pounds has been received from Blackawton Parish Church to support the repair of the steps. Payments were approved for £369.60 for salary for February 2016 and £92.20 HMRC PAYE for February 2016. It was agreed that the invoice for £2,232 for the Community Bus to the Ivy Lane Centre was not correct and that the Clerk would follow this up.

Proposed SHDC locality fund grant application to install a phone line and WiFi in the Village Hall

It was agreed to discuss sharing WiFi access with the Community Shop.

Signature of agreement to receive agenda and summons by email

The document was signed by all Parish Councillors present.

Maintenance and insurance of churchyard wall and entrances

The quote for a professional survey and maintenance recommendation report for the churchyard wall and steps was noted but not accepted at this time. It was agreed that proactive maintenance was required and that this might be achieved using local expertise. Cllr Joyce will follow up sourcing maintenance locally and the estimate of costs to replace the churchyard wall and steps for an all-risks insurance quote.

Bus to Dartmouth Caring lunch clubs

Dartmouth Caring / West Dart Bus to provide transport from Blackawton, Stoke Fleming, Strete and Dittisham to lunch clubs on Wednesday and Thursday starting in March.

Employment of parish clerk and responsible financial officer

No councillors or members of the public remained at the meeting. The clerk left the meeting at this point and did not return. The minute for this item was made by Cllr Rake. BPC expressed gratitude for and complete satisfaction with the clerk's work so far and it was agreed to extend for three months the interim arrangements for filling the post of clerk and RFO. It was agreed that the process for selecting a new permanent clerk and RFO outlined in the 'Draft Recruitment Process' document would be followed, with the possible addition of a shortlisting stage by the full council before interviews by the selection committee. It was agreed that the selection committee would be Cllrs Rake and Mallyon.

The Parish Council's next meeting is at 7.30 pm on **Tuesday 5th April**. You are most welcome to attend and to raise any issues which may be of concern to you.


