Vicar's Letter from Revd Alison Shaw

Dear Friends,

I have just returned from an exhausting, challenging and awesome visit to the Holy Land. It was my sixth trip since 2005 and every time I learn more of that amazing but troubled land.

I was a delegate to an international conference and we stayed in Bethlehem and Nazareth, visiting sacred sites and more unusual spots too. It was a real privilege to see, for the first time, the mosque at Al-Aqsa, seldom open to non-Muslims these days, and likewise the Dome of the Rock from where it is said the Prophet Mohammed ascended to Heaven, talked with the Prophet Jesus and returned to Earth to continue his work. We visited The Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem and a beautiful modern church by the Sea of Galilee where the altar is designed as a stunning wooden boat. And all these visual and spiritual 'treats' between a feast of lectures and discussions with Christian, Jewish and Islamic scholars. And speaking of feasts - cheeses and olives, pitta bread, hummus, pickles and salads, St Peter fish, sweet cakes, and 'Star of Bethlehem' wine from the Cremisan vineyards near Bethlehem. We walked too through the deserted parts of Hebron (the place where in the Tombs of the Patriarchs, Abraham and his wife Sarah are buried), and stood on the Golan Heights and looked across into Syria. So many places we hear about on our news channels, we saw and experienced a little.

In September 2018 I shall be leading a pilgrimage to the Land we call Holy. Maybe these few words have caught your imagination and it's somewhere you'd like to visit? People there would invite you to 'come and see'. Do please contact me if you'd like to know more.

As we continue through Lent and into Easter, it is my prayer that we all take time to reflect, not only on what happened to a unique and special man called Jesus 2,000 years ago and what Christians believe, but on the lives lived in Palestine and Israel today. There is so much to question, so much to learn and we wonder what our response to world events should be. For me, the best words come from the prophet Micah who posed the question: "What does God require of me?" And the answer: "To act justly, to love with compassion, and to walk humbly with our God". As we continue our journey through the year, let's do our best to promote justice, to love unconditionally and to work for equality, both here in the peaceful South Hams and across the world.

Easter blessings of new life and new hope to you all.

Booking the Village Hall

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

- 1. Enter http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81 in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.
- 2. Via Facebook (www.facebook.com); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<< Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 7th March 2017

(For details, please see the minutes or contact your Parish Council)

Cllrs Rake (Chairman), Joyce (Vice-Chairman), Mallyon, Perry, and Wills were present as were Cllr Hicks (South Hams District Council), Cllr Hawkins (Devon County Council), A Thom (Clerk) and two members of the public.

Open Forum

- a) **Dangerous road at Halwell**. A member of the public discussed their concerns about the poor condition of the section of road between Halwell and Totnes Cross and requested a 'dangerous road' sign to warn drivers. County Cllr Hawkins advised the repair works will be done later in the year. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to DCC.
- b) **Adoption of the BT kiosk**. The Clerk advised the adoption is complete and BPC is now the legal owner of the kiosk.

Report from District Councillor

Cllr Hawkins reported that DCC set its budget in February. He said children, social services and mental health have been prioritised. There will be a meeting with Dr Sarah Wollaston MP and NHS representatives in Townstal Community Hall in April about the closure of Dartmouth Hospital. The new highways contract commences on 1 April 2017 and achieves a £1.9 million saving which will be reinvested in rural roads.

Report from County Councillor

Cllr Hicks reported that the Joint Local Plan will shortly commence a six week consultation. It will then be considered by the Inspectorate for six to eight months. SHDC forecasts a deficit of £600,000 for 2020.


