Wormcharming Charity Donations Announced

The weather for this year's International Festival of Wormcharming held in Blackawton in May was a lot less kind than in previous years. Fewer teams took part and the number of spectators was, not surprisingly, down when compared with sunnier years. None-the-less, the Wormcharmers are still able to donate nearly £2,000 to local charities.

Worm Master Nat Lowson paid tribute to those who had generously given to collections on the day, bought raffle tickets and maybe grabbed a bargain at the Auction which, in the evening, brings the event to a close. Even Official Cheat Peter Hathaway had to agree. "The object of the event is obviously for everyone to have fun in our lovely village by indulging in some typically English nonsense and perhaps relaxing to some brilliant music and maybe enjoying a drink or two. But the fact that we can tap into people's generosity for the benefit of those worse off than ourselves is clearly a big bonus".

From this year's donations, £1,000 will be going to Devon Air Ambulance Trust; this will bring to nearly £9,500 the amount given to the Trust by Wormcharming since 2007. The Village's Community Shop, which is currently looking for new premises, will receive £200 as will Dartmouth Caring. £100 will go to the Breakthrough Organisation and £50 to the local Young Farmers Group.

A sum of £150 was also set aside for a fund available for Blackawton residents – particularly young people – raising money for charity or undertaking sponsored events etc. on their own initiative. This concept was originally the idea of former Blackawton's George Inn publican Vic Hall who sadly passed away in 2009. Still sadly missed, Vic was a stalwart of Wormcharming and loved the annual event. The reserved sum will continue to be known as "Vic's Fund".

The remaining cash will be invested in some badly needed P.A. equipment to help future Wormcharming events run even more smoothly.

Then there are the 86 shareholders whose cash helped us to get the shop off the ground in the first place. There are a dozen people on the Management Committee plus others who lend a hand when Phase 3 is being discussed. We also have all the customers who make use of the shop and without whom it certainly wouldn't be there.

Then there are the various Grant Making Bodies, South Hams District, Devon County and Blackawton Parish Councils, whose advice, support and cash contributions have helped out enormously and The Plunkett Foundation whose assistance in getting through the minefield of rules and regulations helped us set up the shop in a proper and legal way.

Then there's the couple of people who receive a small wage for the specific work which they do and without whose enthusiasm, commitment and hard work have been essential in helping the shop become what it is now.

Of course, some people fit into more than one of these lists. In fact I can think of at least one person who is a volunteer while, at the same time, being a shareholder, Management Committee Member, customer and local Councillor!

Anyway, the point is that the debt of gratitude owed to so many people is properly recognised; so may we say a big and sincere **thank you** to everyone involved for their efforts...long may your support continue.

Meat Supplies

Don't forget that the Aune Valley Meat Co. is supplying meat to the shop these days. We are getting excellent feedback on the quality of these products and you might want to give them a try. The shop will order any particular meat which you may want – the shop has a detailed list of the wide range which Aune Valley provides.

Orders

Don't forget that, as well as meat, you can order other groceries at the shop or by 'phone and the staff will be pleased to help you out. Even if we currently do not stock a particular product you want, just let us know and we will see if we can order it for you and maybe stock it on a regular basis.

Delivery?

If you have problems in carrying your shopping home, we may be able to deliver it for you. Just ask one of our volunteers and we will try to arrange for it to be brought to your door.

Post Office Opening Times

We mentioned in the last Beacon that, during the summer, we are occasionally short of volunteers who are able to provide Post Office services. We do apologise for this but your shop really is totally dependent upon volunteers. Unless one of more people are prepared to give up a bit of their time to help out, then I am afraid that, at holiday times, some "blank spaces" are inevitable. For example, at the moment it looks like the Post Office service will need to cease service at 11 am on the following dates: Saturday 1 August, Tuesday 4 August, and Thursday 6 August.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 7th July 2015

Cllrs Coe, Lewis-Davis, Mallyon, Perry, Rake and Wills were present with Cllrs Hawkins (DCC) and Hicks (SHDC) and Steve Gale (Parish Clerk) attending. There were apologies from Cllr Joyce.

Reports from District and County Councillors

Cllr Hicks will shortly meet Daniel Martin, the new South Hams Locality Manager for here. It was agreed to invite him to a future Parish Council Meeting. Cllr Hicks had tried to obtain further information concerning Town Farm but with no success.

The first Surgery run by Cllr Hicks had taken place. He will continue to operate these sessions with the next being prior to the Parish Council on 1 September.

Cllr Hawkins updated the meeting on the Dartmouth Indoor Swimming Pool, car parking in Dartmouth particularly the Park'n'ride and its use by season ticket holders and the disappointing take up of the youth club bus.

Comments on Planning Applications

06/1215/15/F Thorne Farm; creation of new driveway etc. **Supported.**

06/1376/15/F George Inn; Retrospective application for retaining wall and level garden area to the rear. **Supported.** Cllr Coe took no part in the discussion or decision of this application.

Bus Services

A rumour had circulated anticipating withdrawal by Devon County of the school bus service from the Village to Dartmouth Academy. Cllr Hawkins reported that this is not the case and the rumour had started following a message concerning services from other areas being sent to the incorrect recipients.

Update on Current Financial Position

The Council's bank balances currently stood at £35,798.45. The total remaining, after allowing for earmarked reserves of £25,418.45, and for payment of creditors as below of £1,223.40, was £11,603.40.

Payments Due and Received

The following payments were agreed and made:

- £120.00 to Grant Thornton for Audit services
- £45.00 to Blackawton Village Hall for hall hire
- £211.60 to HMRC for PAYE taxation
- £846.80 to the Parish Clerk for 3 month's salary

Memorial Testing

Cllrs Perry and Wills had undertaken a series of memorial tests. A further test will be undertaken later in the year.

Neighbourhood Watch

It was agreed that the Council would offer its involvement to the discussions currently being suggested concerning the development of Neighbourhood Watch.

Care of Grass Banks and Verges

Councillors reported problems with the care of grass banks adjoining main roads, in particular the verge on the double bend at the crown of the hill close to the former Forces pub. Councillors will pass details to the Clerk who will raise these with Cllr Hawkins and Highways.

Road Signs

It was reported that the directional finger post opposite the Forces is still missing after at least a year. In addition, an unknown lorry had hit and dislodged the 30 mph post and sign adjacent to the Community Village Shop.

Yurt

The appearance of a large yurt in a field within the village was reported. It was understood that this structure was only a temporary measure and subject to a planning application currently being considered. The situation will continue to be monitored.

Potential Meeting Attendance

It was agreed to invite the Chair and Vice-Chair of South Hams District Council to attend a Parish Council Meeting in September, October or November.

Clerk's Corner

Parish Councils...a literary companion!

You may have seen the TV mini series *A Casual Vacancy*. This was based on the book of the same name which was J K Rowling's first novel for adults (presumably having tired of Harry Potter!). The novel is set in the West Country and begins with the death of a beloved Parish Councillor. Consequently, a seat on the council is vacant and conflict ensues before the election for his successor takes place.

Former Exeter University student Rowling is not the first author to seek plots in the intrigue of Parish Council affairs. Henry Williamson – he of *Tarka the Otter* fame - published two extremely amusing books of tales centring round the discussions and actions of the local Parish Council, in a real but unnamed typical Devon Village. The village was full of colourful local characters and boasted two pubs, one at the top of the hill and the other, about 200 yards away, halfway down the hill. Does that remind you of anywhere? *Life in a Devon Village* and *Tales from a Devon Village* were written either side of the Second World War in North Devon and many of the themes written about then seem surprisingly contemporary even now.

A number of Parishes and Parish Councils have produced their own handbooks and histories and rumour has it that at least one current Parish Clerk is gathering stories with a view to turning them into a further book at some stage. Who says Parish Councils are boring?!

Your Parish Council's next meeting will take place at 7.30 pm on **Tuesday 4th August** in the Village Hall. It is hoped to be able to discuss a number of issues including:

- Future changes to the NHS, including the closure of Dartmouth Hospital and relocation of Dartmouth Medical Practice;
