I am pleased to report that the running of the West Dart Bus has now been taken over by Ivybridge and District Community Transport Association (IDCTA) and is operating smoothly.

Tony Hemmings continues to drive the bus on the school runs between Dittisham and Blackawton School and the contract with Devon County Council has been taken on by IDCTA. Meanwhile, the bus does regular trips with our volunteer drivers to Dartmouth, Totnes and Newton Abbot as advertised each month in the Beacon. We are concerned by the lack of support for the Totnes trip (1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month) and would encourage Blackawtonians to take advantage of this excellent and friendly service. We have recently acquired two new volunteer drivers which will help ensure that our commitments are fulfilled.

If demand for the Totnes run remains minimal we may consider reducing this trip to once per month and replacing it with a trip to Kingsbridge, which we used to do many years ago. Your views would be appreciated, please!

Debbie Di Bello is our local coordinator who deals with the paperwork and multitude of forms that need to be sent off to Ivybridge and on to DCC. She liaises between Tony, the volunteer drivers and IDCTA and can be contacted on ddibello@gmail.com. Booking the Village Hall

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

1. Enter <http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81> in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.
2. Via Facebook (www.facebook.com); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<<Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

1267/17/ADV The Dartmouth Hotel, Golf And Spa, Blackawton Totnes, TQ9 7DE. Advertisement consent for replacement of a permanent sign identifying business premises. **Advertisement Consent granted.**

Review of New Applications

1941/17/FUL Broadley Farm, Blackawton. Devon, TQ9 7AJ. Provision of livestock building to serve existing dairy farm. **Supported.**

1972/17/FUL Land at Greenslade Road, Blackawton, TQ9 7BP. Application for erection of four dwellings (resubmission of 3442/16/FUL). **Support** of the small scale development in principle however issues raised in previous application regarding highways and drainage have not been resolved.

1776/17/CLE Foxglove Barn, Blackawton, TQ9 7DG. Lawful Development Certificate for an existing conservatory. To the best of BPC's knowledge the conservatory has been present since 2006 or 2007.

Blackawton Community Field, Blackawton, TQ9 7AY. Erection of a 10 metre lighting column for provision of lighting for emergency night landing of Devon Air Ambulance helicopter. BPC has submitted this application. Validation issues are being addressed. BPC supports the application.

It was agreed to accept Allwood's quote to repair the remaining unsafe memorial with dowels at a cost of £35.00. It was agreed that BPC would write to a mason who carried out unauthorised works to memorials objecting to the works in its cemetery and advising that no payment will be made for them.

Reports from Parish Councillors and Wardens

Village Hall Events Noise Complaint

Events in the Hall have been asked to turn music off at 10.30 pm. The Village Hall has a licence to play music until 12 o'clock midnight or later if an extension for a later time has been approved. The Parish Council encourages people to consider their neighbours and also values Blackawton's community celebrations. If there is a problem with noise complainants are asked to please use only official channels.

Town Farm Development

The Town Farm development was discussed. The Clerk was asked to arrange a meeting with Linden Homes. This meeting took place on 19 July 2017. Linden Homes plans to start October 2017 and to build to the approved plans. It is bound by the existing S.106 agreement which includes the construction of a multiuse games area and employment units. Linden Homes will aim for completion in 24 months, but will reduce the pace of the build if the homes are not selling. BPC has asked for the construction management plan to include avoidance of deliveries at school pick up drop off times.
