Memories from Rev'd John Bell

When I enter someone's home, I am surrounded by memories. Photos of babies, weddings, anniversaries, holidays and pets, and then there are the ornaments – often referred to as memorabilia – granny's old vase, a painting or a hand-me-down doll or teddy bear. I've still got my shabby teddy, I called him Cuddly, and, on my office bookshelf rests my father's old Ilford Sportsman 35mm camera, oh, and in my socks drawer is one of my mother's silk headscarves, which I remember her wearing when I was a child; now and again I take it out and feel its soft texture and remember my mother's auburn hair.

Smells can also connect us with the past. Wallflowers and hyacinths do it for me. Wallflowers take me back to my childhood family home in Saint John's Road, Bath, where, on a hot summer's day I can clearly recall, indeed my olfactory sense can imagine, the smell of that rich scent as I played in the yard. My mother used to buy hyacinths to remind her of her sister Henrietta, who died of cancer when she was in her 40's. On the anniversary of Henri's death a bowl of hyacinths would appear, and I looked forward to them opening out on the window ledge, releasing their intoxicating perfume.

I think Jesus knew what he was doing when he asked his followers to remember him in bread and wine. We call it Holy Communion, the Eucharist, Breaking of Bread, The Lord's Supper, and so on, depending upon our tradition. The technical word anamnesis is sometimes used in church-speak. It's about

remembering the past and bringing it into the present. And so it is that when I eat the bread and drink the wine during Holy Communion, all that my Lord means to me from what I've read about him: his life, death and resurrection, comes flooding back into the present. The bread and wine are tokens of his Passion, but I do not need to visit his tomb to feel a connection, because his Spirit makes past, present and future coalesce: "Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again" we proclaim with conviction during Christian worship.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 6th January 2015

Notes only; for detail please refer to Blackawton Community Website: www.blackawtoncommunity.com. Cllrs Coe, Donaldson, Mallyon, Rake, Lewis-Davis, Wills and Wreyford were present with Cllrs Hawkins (DCC) and Tucker (SHDC) and Steve Gale (Parish Clerk) in attendance.

TAPS Funding - Youth Club

An application for £2,000 has been made. This would fund Dartmouth Academy to transport young people from Blackawton and Dittisham to and from the Ivy Lane Youth Club on Thursday nights.

Budget/Precept for 2015/16

A paper had been produced recommending a rise of income of £1,000 over the previous year. This was largely to expand local services to make up for County-wide service reductions. The resulting precept for 2015/16 (for £13,091) was unanimously agreed. This will be supplemented by a Council Tax Support Grant of £659 making a total request for income of £13,750 (compared with £12,750 in 2014/15)

New Housing Estate

Conditions are still being discussed between South Hams and the contractor. These will determine hours of working and noise levels etc. while the work is carried out.

The Community Shop Management Committee will continue to discuss whether or not it would be prepared to act as Managers of the Community Employment Units to be constructed as part of the overall project.

Clerk's Corner

Election Time!

We'll scarcely have recovered from Wormcharming on Sunday 3rd May when there's the small matter of a General Election on the **Thursday 7th May**. At the same time, the **Parish Council Elections** will also be held. We'll keep you up to date with progress on the local selection of councillors through the pages of the Beacon each month. To start off, current Chairman Alan Mallyon has written on the **front page** of this Beacon.

A Youth Club for Blackawton?

Ever since the previous club in the Village Hall had to cease because of a lack of support from parents, a facility for young people in the Parish has been sorely missed. To try to compensate for this loss, the Parish Council has applied for special South Hams funding (called "TAPS funding") to pay for transport for kids from Blackawton to go to the Ivy Lane Youth Club in Dartmouth on Thursday evenings. The bus – which will also call at Dittisham – will kindly be provided at cost price by Dartmouth Academy. Let's hope that this proposal is agreed.

Next Year's Council Tax

You probably know that the cost of your Parish Council is only a tiny element of your total local tax bill. None-the-less, the Council tries to keep its finances to a minimum. With the reduction of various services from Devon County because of its own financial strictures, it is inevitable that pressure to provide services within the Parish will increase. To allow for this, a small increase of £1,000 has been sought for 2015/16. This equates to an increase of just £1.64 a year for every elector!

Watch out!

Police have received reports of two or three men in their late twenties to early thirties knocking door to door in the South Hams area. They are attempting to arrange surveys for Energy Performance Certificates (EPC's) They have ID cards but these are believed to be home made. They have been employing aggressive techniques saying that it is a legal requirement for each house to have one. This is not the case - it is only required when you are selling a property and would be discussed with you by your agent.
