Reader's Corner from Jenny Harris

It was on the remote yet beautiful island of Iona in Scotland, during the sixth century that Saint Columba brought Christianity. It was here in medieval times, Benedictine monks and nuns established a community devoted to prayer, hospitality and service. It was here during the later part of the 20th century, that the present-day Iona Community brought clergy and craftsmen, together with thousands of volunteers from across the world, to rebuild the ruined monastic buildings and re-establish the common life of prayer, hospitality and service. On Iona, it is not difficult to catch the spirit of those early Celtic and Benedictine monks, who cried "Glory to God" as they lived surrounded by the beauty of nature, the dignity of work and worship, and holding all things in common. Hosannas came naturally on Iona.

The Iona Community believe that their actions and decisions should reflect the Gospel message in every part of life. Their faith shows up in the ordinary things, in work, in relationships, politics, economics and citizenship. As a praying and singing community their prayers and songs express their deep faith in Jesus Christ, the one who loved the poor and dispossessed, and brought healing and hope to those who were unnoticed and despised. They go to the peace and beauty of Iona and invites others to join them, in order that they may be strengthened to go back to their homes, to face the local and global challenges of poverty, racism, violence and war, and to walk in faith behind Jesus, the Light of the World. Sometimes in all the rush and hurry of our lives we need so much, just now and then, to find an island of peace, tranquillity and above all **hope**. If you have the opportunity to go to this incredible place, go and be transformed.

Is the wall thin between our whispers

And His listening? I only know

The world grows less and less -

#### **Booking the Village Hall**

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. We now have a Facebook page; I'm not very familiar with Facebook yet so it may take a while for things to appear correctly. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

- 1. Enter http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81 in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.
- 2. Via Facebook (www.facebook.com); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<< Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

#### Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

### **Parish Council**

#### Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 10th January 2017

(For details, please see the minutes or contact your Parish Council)

Cllrs Rake (Chairman), Joyce (Vice-Chairman), Mallyon, Coe, Perry, Wills and Lewis-Davis were present as were Cllr Hicks (South Hams District Council), Annette Thom (Clerk), and four members of the public. Apologies were received from Cllr Hawkins (Devon County Council).

#### Open forum

- A member of the public questioned the planned maintenance of the Blackawton playground and its funding which were reported in the December 2016 Blackawton Beacon. Cllrs explained that the Playing Fields Committee has been advised that major maintenance including steam cleaning is required. Grant funds will be sought. The PC has agreed it will make a grant to support this community resource.
- A member of the public raised a problem with noise from the Village Hall the preceding Sunday. An apology was made and it was noted that if users can keep the doors closed noise is contained.
- A member of the public reported on the progress made in cleaning up the Blackawton phone box. They questioned progress made in adopting the box and raised the issue of fund raising. Cllr Lewis-Davis reported that the request has been made to adopt the box, however the processing of the application is out of BPC's control and slowed by the large number of applications being processed by BT. It was agreed that community fund raising would be pursued.

#### **Planning**

The following SHDC decisions were noted:

3457/16/COL Oldstone Farm Solar Park, Blackawton, Totnes, TQ9 7DG. Circular 14/90 application to erect a short overhead line. **Approval**.

3952/16/NMM The Normandy Arms, Chapel Street, Blackawton, Devon, TQ9 7BN. Application for non-material amendment for proposed alterations including two new sun tunnels to 1st floor, changes to a single ground floor window and blocking up a single window to allow more usable space and two new roof lights. This is following grant of planning permission 0814/16/FUL. **Conditional approval**.

#### **New Applications**

3442/16/FUL

Land at Greenslade Road, Blackawton, Totnes, TQ9 7BP. Application for erection of four dwellings. This application was discussed at length. It was unanimously resolved that BPC would respond communicating BPC's concerns about the negative visual impact of the current proposal, supporting the concerns raised by SHDC's Conservation Officer in his assessment of the proposal and the concerns raised by the SHDC Officer about lack of information about drainage management, and raising the issue of increased traffic at the Normandy Arms intersection. The response will note BPC's support of this scale of development and the proposed new footpath link.

3955/16/PDM

Watson Barn, Park Lane, Blackawton, Totnes, TQ9 7AA. Notification for prior approval for proposed change of use of agricultural building to a dwellinghouse and associated works. It is understood that land on which this building is located is rented for stock (sheep) to graze on it and that the building which is the subject of this application has been used separately by the owner of the land as a workshop. This pattern of use has been established for a long period of time – greater than twenty years. It was also noted that a tractor had been stored in the building at one time. This information will be communicated for SHDC to incorporate into its due diligence.

Tangerine Tree, 50 High Street, Totnes, TQ9 5SQ. Application for variation to the premises licence. Closes 1 February 2017. No comment.

#### **Consultations**

South Hams District and West Devon Borough Councils' Joint Homeless Strategy. Closes 13 February 2017. No comment.

Proposed Visit from Senior SHDC Planning Officer. It was agreed that this visit would be useful and BPC would host other PCs in BVH. It was agreed that the Clerk would also post on the Blackawton Community website information about material planning considerations and how to make influential and relevant comments on planning applications.

#### **Finance**

Update on Current Financial Position. Allowing for payments to be made and earmarked reserves of £32,644.98, a balance of unearmarked reserves of £7,341.57 remained.

Payments Made, Due and Received. It was resolved to approve the following payments:

- Westdown Farm Ltd for Cemetery hedgetrimming: £54.00
- Clerk for Salary December: £435.20
- HMRC for PAYE December: 31.20
- Clerk for Expenses CE01: £112.87
- Blackawton Fireworks for replacement of cheque 48: £50.00

#### Churchyard fence and grass maintenance

This item was moved up the Agenda because the decision impacts on the 2017/18 budget. It was resolved that it is not feasible for BPC to arrange for sheep to be grazed in the churchyard, therefore the current fences will be removed and the grass cut.

#### 2017/18 Budget

Approval of the 2017/18 Budget. Cllrs resolved to adopt Option 1 described in the Budget Report with the amendment of an increased churchyard cuts budget of £1,500. This allows BPC to take actions identified by the December meeting to support community projects. It requires an increase in the precept.

Setting of the 2017/18 precept demand. It was resolved that the combined precept council tax support income required is £18,000 which requires a precept demand of £17,465.

#### Reports from Parish Councillors and Wardens

- Village Christmas tree and Christmas tree lights. Action necessary to replace the tree and lights in time for Christmas 2017 will be on the February 2017 Agenda with Cllrs to liaise and research in the interim.
- Rope across the bridleway at Greenslade. Cllr Joyce will discuss with landowner.
- Cllr Wills will bring the book about the history of Blackawton to the Annual Parish Meeting.
- Cllr Joyce and users of the Park will discuss the project to install a village Skate Park at the next Playing Field Committee Meeting.
- Cllr Mallyon will book the necessary maintenance of the Blackawton Playground. More work will be done to raise funds.
- Cllrs Rake and Joyce agreed to volunteer for Whist and Euchre washing up duty on 23 January 2017.

The Parish Council's next meeting will take place on Tuesday 7th Febuary 2017 at 7.30 pm. You are most welcome to attend and to raise any issues which may be of concern to you.
