For the first time for many years we will be celebrating **New Year's Eve** with a **special supper**. This will be bookings **only**, 2 or 3 course menu at £19.95 or 21.95 respectively; see menu on the right.

Understanding that most people have lots of food at home, not so much in the way of funds, especially with those credit card bills landing on the doorstep, our kitchen will be closed on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday throughout January **except** for **Monday 25th January** when we will celebrate **British comfort food** in this dark and dismal season; with a nod to *Burns' Night*, the haggis will feature. Otherwise our kitchen will not be staffed on Monday thru Wednesday in January **unless** we have table reservations. So, the kitchen will only be staffed on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesdays during January **if** we have bookings for diners. The bar will, as always, be open every day.

Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

Currently, one of the small plastic tables is missing from the hall. If you have it and have forgotten to return it, **please do so as soon as possible**.

Booking the Village Hall

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. We now have a Facebook page; I'm not very familiar with Facebook yet so it may take a while for things to appear correctly. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

1. Enter http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81 in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.

2. Via Facebook (www.facebook.com); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<< Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

Cllrs Cllrs Joyce, Perry, Rake (Vice Chairman) and Wills were present with Cllr Hicks (SHDC) attending and apologies received from Cllrs Coe, Hawkins (DCC), Lewis-Davis, Mallyon (Chairman) and Steve Gale (Parish Clerk).

Planning Application

06/2523/15/F Sea Glimpse: demolish current building and replace by 4 bedroomed bungalow. After some detailed discussion it was agreed that there would be no comment on the application.

Update on Current Financial Position

The bank balances currently stood at £39,835.63. Allowing for payments to be made and earmarked reserves of £29,408.26, a balance of £10,377.37 remained.

TAPS Funding

Although a number of potential uses were discussed, no proposals for TAPS funding were made apart from continuing support for the joint scheme with Dittisham to improve local road ways and drainage etc.

Budget/Precept 2016/17

Next year's precept was discussed in some detail with it unanimously agreed by those present that the precept should remain at the same level for the next financial year.

Clerk's Corner

At a special meeting on 17th December, the Council noted with regret that the Clerk was currently unable to fulfil his duties for health reasons and that, in accordance with the terms of his contract, he would be

taking leave with immediate effect. The Councillors extended their best wishes to the Clerk for a swift improvement in his health.

Councillors voted unanimously to ask Dr Annette Thom, currently Clerk at Dittisham Parish Council, to provide interim cover until after the March meeting of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council's next meeting is at 7.30 pm on Tuesday 5th January. You are most welcome to attend and to raise any issues which may be of concern to you.
