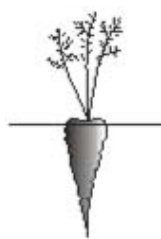
Parish Council Elections

Reader's Ramblings

from **Sally Green**

I am writing this in February. We've had some fantastic days of sunshine with several mornings of sparkling frost. From my upstairs sitting room I'm looking out onto a field with several ewes, all with new-born lambs frolicking all over the place. Full of joy. Obviously, they are not looking into the future but enjoying their present life! Meanwhile, life in our world goes on. So much needless suffering on a daily basis – in countries like Syria, Iraq, S. Sudan and many W. African countries. At the heart of it the Ebola epidemic; but also fanatical religious beliefs leading to the massacre of people in increasingly violent ways; to loss of homes, crops, health and work. Such sadness to me. Something I think about, and pray about, every day.

In church speak we are in the season of Lent, the six-week period leading up to Good Friday and Easter in early April. It is a time for new beginnings, God's springtime. New beginnings start with repentance. Repentance is not something negative. It involves recognising wrong and where possible putting it right. Making a U-turn. It is an opportunity to turn back to God, to experience his love and forgiveness afresh. Unending love is who God is. Lent is a time when we try to make space for God. To stop dashing about for a brief moment and ponder the important questions of life – what am I doing with my life? where am I going? what do I need to change? will the world be a better place for my contribution to the life of this community and to our world?

Lent is also a season of great hope because it ends with Good Friday and Easter. Jesus' death on the cross for the sins of the world, followed by the glory of Easter Day when Jesus conquered death once and for all. Then rose victorious and lives in the hearts of all who call themselves Christians.

May I end by telling you a lovely story. A young angel was being shown around by a more experienced angel. The little angel saw whirling galaxies, blazing suns, interstellar space, and finally the galaxy of which our own solar system is a part. The senior angel finally pointed out our insignificant planet Earth. What's special about that one, he asked. That planet, replied the senior angel, has been visited by the Prince of Glory. He did it because he loves the people there; he went down to visit them so he could lift them up to become like him. As St John put it in his gospel: God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son . . . to be the means by which our sins are forgiven.

Women's World Day of Prayer

Women's World Day of Prayer is an international interchurch organisation which enables us to hear the voices of women from a different part of the world each year, expressing their hopes and concerns and bringing them before the rest of the world in prayer.

On Friday 6th March an estimated 3 million people, in over 170 countries, will gather to observe the day of prayer, using an order of service written by Christian women from The Bahamas and translated into over 1000 different languages and dialects. In the British Isles alone over 5,000 services will be held. The day will begin when the sun rises over the island of Samoa, and continue until it sets off the coast of American Samoa some 35 hours later.

The theme of the service is taken from St John's Gospel, chapter 13 verses 1-17: **Jesus said to them: 'Do you know what I have done to you?'** and it challenges us to demonstrate the same radical unconditional love for others that Jesus showed when he washed the feet of his disciples.

The Bahamas consists of over 700 islands scattered over 100,000 square miles in the Atlantic Ocean, only a small proportion of which are inhabited. It refers to itself as a 'family of islands' and in the service the needs of the smallest islands are given as much prominence as those of the larger ones.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 3rd February 2015

Notes only; for detail please refer to Blackawton Community Website: www.blackawtoncommunity.com. Cllrs Coe, Donaldson, Mallyon, Rake, Lewis-Davis, Wills and Wreyford were present with Cllrs Hawkins (DCC) and Tucker (SHDC) and Steve Gale (Parish Clerk) in attendance.

Reports from County and District Councillors

Cllr Tucker updated the Council on: business rates and solar farms; national regulations on affordable housing units and South-West Water's policy regarding underground leakages.

Cllr Hawkins reported on Devon County's attempts to stay within a 3% cap on its expenditure whilst consulting on a number of issues in attempting to reduce service reductions to a minimum.

Community Shop

The Community Shop Management Committee will discuss again whether or not it might act as Managers of the Community Employment Units in the Town Farm Project.

New Planning Applications

- 18/0048/15/F Field SX28395364, Capton; 50kw wind turbine. By a vote of 4 to 3 it was agreed to **support** this application.
- 18/0119/15/F Field SX85655259, Dittisham; 0.225mw wind turbine. By a vote of 4 to 1 (with 2 abstentions) it was agreed to **support** this application.

06/0148/15/F Barn Court, Dreyton Cross; replacement dwelling and ancillary accommodation. All Councillors agreed to let the Clerk have their comments by 18 February. A consensus decision will be then passed on to South Hams.

Update on Current Financial Position

The bank accounts held £29,914.08. After payments of £40.30 (see below) and allowance for earmarked reserves (£21,938.25) a general reserve of £7,897.93 remained. The following payments were agreed and made:

Chq 031: £15.30 for travelling expenses during training to A Mallyon

Chq 032: £25.00 for training to Devon Association of Local Councils.

Annual Meeting

It was confirmed that the next Meeting, on Tuesday 3 March 2015, will be the Annual Parish Meeting. Outside speakers will be sought on: the future of broadband in Blackawton; the work of Dartmouth Caring; the impact of the Town Farm including the new Employment Units; and forthcoming local elections.

Light refreshments will be made available after the meeting.

Reports from Councillors

The following points were raised:

- One of the Blackawton signs was now down and had been reported to County Highways. Details of the standards of signage required will be sought so that the possibility of replacing this locally may be investigated.
- New grit boxes had been delivered, put into place and filled.
- The old "Beacon" school sign in Main Street had been refurbished and re-seated thanks to the generosity of a local resident.

Next Meeting

It was confirmed that the next three Parish Council dates would take place as follows:

- Tuesday 3 March: **Annual Parish Meeting**
- Tuesday 7 April: Business Meeting – n.b. this is the day after a Bank Holiday
- Tuesday 12 May: **Annual General Meeting** – n.b. one week later than usual (to allow for election on 7 May).

All meetings will be held at the Village Hall and will start at 7.30 pm.

Meet Your Council!

Yes, it's time for this year's **Annual Meeting**. Your chance to meet your Parish Councillors and hear some (hopefully) interesting presentations from local and "outside" speakers on topics of interest to parishioners.

This year, in addition to a brief presentation on the Chairman's Annual Report and a discussion on the forthcoming elections there will be speakers on the following topics:

Broadband and the information super-highway in Blackawton

Dan Piper, Senior Project Manager, representing the *Connecting Devon and Somerset Programme*, will present what is being done as part of the programme and what is planned to be achieved for the area.

Fed up with slow broadband? Come and find out what's going on!

What is *Connecting Devon and Somerset*?

It has been set up to deliver next generation broadband infrastructure to areas where the market has failed to invest.

It is a public-private partnership of six local authorities (Somerset, Devon, North Somerset, Torbay, Plymouth and Bath and North East Somerset) and our delivery partner BT. Somerset is the accountable body for the programme.

What are they going to go?

They aim to bring superfast broadband to 90% of premises in the area covered by the Connecting Devon and Somerset programme. This means that most residents and businesses in Devon and Somerset will have broadband speeds of over 24Mbps by the end of 2016. By then, they also aim to ensure that every premises within the area has a broadband speed of at least 2Mbps.

The work of Dartmouth Caring

Parish Council Election 7 May 2015

The backbone of Blackawton is its community and it is gratifying to know that the strength in this community will help us come to terms with the challenges heading our way over the next few years.

The impact of the impending Town Farm development needs to be sensitively managed. Then there is the impact of the various changes which are heading our way thanks to changes at national government level. Devon County and South Hams District funding from central government has been, and will continue to be reduced. This must mean either cuts which will be faced by all of us, or the Parish filling the gap by operating some of its own services.

The devolvment of various services such as road gritting, restocking the grit bins, looking after our own buddle holes, weed killing the verges, grass cutting and maintenance of road signs are but a few examples of these responsibilities. Some of these we already do. One thing is certain: from now on we have to "look after ourselves" more than we have in the past – and this is going to be quite a task for the future. Add to this the ongoing and current responsibilities of looking after the community assets and network of footpaths and you will realise that a strong Parish Council is of vital importance.

This year is an election year, not just for those vying for votes nationally in the General Election in May but for Parish Councils too. In order to continue the good work Blackawton needs a strong Parish Council, one that is prepared to tackle the problems, challenges and opportunities, and is elected by the whole community. To ensure we have this election there have to be more than 7 people wishing to stand. The only criteria are you have to be over 18 years old and have resided in, owned land in, or worked in the Parish for a minimum of 12 months.

So please take some time to think seriously about your village and whether or not **you** would like to be involved in shaping the future of Blackawton for its community.


