Reader's Ramblings

from Frank Robinson

I am writing just after Easter, the greatest of the Christian festivals and just as we enter the General Election campaign proper. For a Christian to say anything 'political' is to invite (perhaps very strong) criticism. And it's particularly tricky for me as a bit of a rebel and someone trained in mathematical economics to hear one politician after another either manipulating (or just plain not understanding) the figures that are important to our material wellbeing.

The Church of England alone has twice as many people in church every Sunday as pay their subscriptions to all the political parties put together (at least five million active Christians!). Perhaps the politicians have noticed. David Cameron spoke on evangelical radio recently saying that he believes the message of Easter involves "hard work and responsibility". Have I missed something?

The Christian message is certainly not one of virtue rewarded: it is the extraordinary, revolutionary idea that people (that's **all** people) have infinite worth in themselves, regardless of their usefulness to others, or anything else. We are here by the grace of God; His infinite, unconditional love.

How we organise our community and care for others in our society involves many complicated issues. I would just say that I think we want passion and commitment in debate, but not misbehaviour; we want the issues that affect daily lives to be treated seriously and not as 'pantomime farce'; and we want politicians to behave like grown-ups, not children – (although children can have a strong sense of the common good).

May God bless and guide all our politicians ... and may God bless all of you.

Phase 3

Shop Management Committee Chairman, Mike North, says that Blackawton Community Shop is looking towards its next evolution - a permanent building (Also known as Phase 3).

"The Portakabin as a shop facility has served the community well, but it is only a temporary solution for a shop and post office. Planning permission for the Portakabin was only granted for three years, within which period we have to be seen to be at least progressing towards a permanent facility.

At a recent Village Hall Committee Meeting, a vote was taken which has given the green light to considering the possibility of a new Shop being on the Village Hall site. So we can now investigate this proposal and a joint sub-committee has been set up with the Village Hall to work together to see how this plan might be progressed through the legal and building implications. The Shop Committee is delighted with this outcome and looks forward to working together with the Village Hall Committee to improve our village facilities, to the benefit us all.

Community Shops are popping up in many villages where a fully commercial shop is unable to make sufficient profit for it to be viable. Blackawton as a community has rallied and, because we have many volunteers who give their time and effort to keep a shop and post office going in our village, we don't have to drive elsewhere, or go without essentials. Blackawton is a thriving and dynamic village that is the envy of many.

The 'new' shop is not going to become a reality soon; it will take time, effort and a great deal of fund-raising and grant support, before bricks can be laid. We are nevertheless confident that it will come to fruition.

In the meantime, please support your local community shop; Sue the manager is always anxious to serve and will try hard to supply most items that are asked for.

So thank you to all the individuals and village organisations that continue to support this community enterprise. If you have any ideas about what a new permanent village shop might be able to provide by way of facilities or products, then do let us know."

Notes of the Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday 7th April 2015

Cllrs Coe, Donaldson, Lewis-Davis, and Wreyford were present with 3 parishioners, Rupert Cotterell and Clare Spearman (British Solar Renewables), Cllr Tucker (SHDC) and Steve Gale (Parish Clerk) attending. There were apologies from Cllrs Rake, Wills and Hawkins (DCC)

Prior to the meeting, British Solar Renewables representatives gave a brief presentation about the firm's outline ideas to locate a solar power base at Oldstone Farm. No formal planning application had been made and the firm would organise a full public consultation meeting if they decided to submit one.

Councillors raised a number of questions including the agricultural quality of the land proposed for the project, the potential "overprovision" of such facilities in close proximity to each other and the potential benefits for the local community.

Report from district councillor

Cllr Tucker announced that, as a result of the re-organisation of Ward areas for the next District Council Elections, this would be his last Blackawton Parish Meeting.

TAPS funding – youth services

TAPS funding had now been approved and now we need to confirm: the timing of the youth club transport service; the start date; the pick-up point(s) etc. Cllr Lewis-Davis would take the lead on this project.

Review of new planning applications

06/0460/15/F Poppy Cottage: Retrospective PVC windows and doors. **No objection** to windows but

councillors concerned about inconsistent South Hams decisions in conservation area.

06/0576/15/F Lilac Cottage: Demolish old extension and replace. **Supported**. The Forge: Remove chimney and replace with flue. **Supported**.

Update on current financial position and end of year accounts

At the end of March, and the 2014/15 financial year, the Bank Statements show £30,100.12. After allowing for £1,330.09 in payments to make and earmarked reserves of £21,938.85, there was £9,491.36 in reserve

The draft Annual Financial Return and General and Financial Risk Assessment were considered and formally, unanimously adopted by the Parish Council.

Payments made, due and received

An urgent payment on 24 February by cheque 033, for £35.56 (inc. £5.93 VAT) to Martin Luck Ltd for stationery was retrospectively approved.

Payments were also agreed and made as follows:

Chq 036 for £211.60 to HMRC for income tax on Clerk's pay

Chq 038 for £161.69 (inc £20.99 VAT) to DALC for membership

Cemetery charges

The Council agreed to raise charges for 2015/16 although it agreed to abolish charges for the scattering of ashes within the cemetery grounds.

Churchyard and cemetery maintenance contract

It was agreed to advertise a tender for the churchyard and cemetery maintenance contract.

NHS Dartmouth steering group

It was agreed that it would be preferable to appoint a Parish representative on the Group from within the community. This issue will be discussed again after the forthcoming election.
