

Reader's Ramblings

from Frank Robinson

There is a lovely book just published by the Bible Society as a tribute to the Queen on her 90th birthday. It is entitled *The Servant Queen* and shows Queen Elizabeth's clear sense of duty and devotion to God and her conception of being the servant of the state of the United Kingdom and of the Commonwealth. Having watched and listened to her over many decades there can be no doubt about whom she serves, and how this has worked out in practice. She is, simply, another Christian, learning and living the lessons of the Christian faith. Jesus (as she fully acknowledges) is her focus.

Jesus said, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves Benefactors (ring any bells??). Instead the greatest among you, should be like the least, and

the one who rules like the one who serves ... I am among you as the one who serves". This is the kingdom service Jesus conferred on his disciples – the ruler is the servant. We have civic rulers who answer to us. When we call, they should come running. And for the least of us, whoever is the least (in Christ's kingdom there is no least!), they are our servants.

Of course, the British monarchy has the trappings of imperial and national self-glory — palaces, servants, jewels, soldiers in big furry hats. But the Queen can stand outside all this. She knows we need to love our neighbours as ourselves and that what the quiet people do — often unseen and unrewarded — moves the world. Her governments often do not see things the same way. They have the power and govern and shape the laws. But they also fail to the extent that they fail to serve. She does, of course, do immeasurably more than I can write here. But her overwhelming example is that the principle of service rules — even when it is ignored or compromised!

So I am proud to say God save and bless the Queen. And God bless all of you.

Blackawton WI from Frances Wood

This month, we had a fascinating talk by Emily Faircloth a forensic radiographer, who in her professional life was a member of the international team that had the task of identifying people killed in international disasters such as the 2004 Asian Tsunami, the Bosnia war and the 7/7 and 9/11 bombings. She explained

how they went about the tasks of identifying even the tiniest body remains. As well as some analytical photos, we were shown some distressing ones. She finished her talk by telling us that her life experience had taught her the three important L's in her life: Live, Love and Laugh.

Village Hall Questionnaire

Thank you to those of you who have returned the questionnaire in last month's Beacon. If you didn't get around to it **please do so before 10th May**, there are more copies of the form available in the Community Shop. The Village Hall Committee wants the views of **as many residents as possible**.

Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

Booking the Village Hall

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. We now have a Facebook page; I'm not very familiar with Facebook yet so it may take a while for things to appear correctly. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

- 1. Enter http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81 in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.
- 2. Via Facebook (www.facebook.com); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<< Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

Cllrs Rake (Chairman), Mallyon, Joyce, Wills, Coe, Perry and Lewis-Davis were present as were Cllr Hicks (SHDC), Cllr Hawkins (DCC), Annette Thom (Locum Clerk), and 4 members of the public.

Election of Chairman

It was unanimously resolved to elect Cllr Rake.

Reports from County and District Councillors

Cllr Hicks noted that the reorganised SHDC is utilising resources reacting to complaints. Its new systems rely on IT systems which have had problems. He apologised, but noted that there have been improvements. Please let Cllr Hicks know when problems occur.

Cllr Hawkins reported that BPC's requests for double yellow lines have passed DCC's first assessment stage and will be advertised. Money is available for DCC to pay for the lines which could be painted within six months. Locality Grant Funds are available. A contribution to a running track has been proposed. Please make requests via the PC.

BPC's presentation to the Development Management Committee on 13 April 2016 regarding 06/1725/15/F Oldstone Farm Solar Park. Cllr Rake reported on the site meeting, which he attended on BPC's behalf, and introduced the application. Cllr Joyce described the approach she would take in her presentation to the

Development Management Committee on 14 April 2016. Despite excellent representations the Committee resolved to grant **conditional approval**.


