Reader's Corner

from **Lyn Robinson**

In a month where we often, like the rhyme, Remember, Remember the 5th of November, and of course Remembrance Day is fast approaching, we can look back at so many people from the past. Ordinary people CAN make an extraordinary difference. I was reading about Elizabeth Fry, who, if you can keep it in your hand long enough, is on the bottom right corner of our £5 notes. She was famous for her work in prison reform, a 'remarkable lady'. Working alongside her was Thomas Buxton (she was his sister-in-law) and you will see him at the top left hand corner of the note wearing glasses. He lived mainly in East London and worked tirelessly for the poor and oppressed.

In 1807, after 18 years of campaigning, Parliament was eventually persuaded by William Wilberforce and others to abolish the slave trade. What I was unaware of was that the practice of slavery itself was still legal, and this affected 800,000 individuals in British colonies across the world. Thirteen years later, in 1820, William Wilberforce, in poor health, asked the recently elected Thomas Buxton MP to take on his 'mantle' and head the anti-slavery movement in Parliament.

Buxton faced huge opposition and personal attack, but finally, on 26th July 1833, the Abolition of Slavery Act was passed – Wilberforce heard the news three days before he died. In passing the 1833 Act, the British Government had to pay out the equivalent of £70 billion in today's money to compensate owners for the loss of slave labour – there was no recompense for the victims themselves!

In fact Thomas Buxton was in many ways an unremarkable man. He didn't enjoy the rough and tumble of politics and was not a particularly gifted speaker. But he said that 'with ordinary talent and extraordinary perseverance, all things are attainable'.

Perhaps like me, you don't see yourself as particularly significant, but who knows what seeds you have sown and what an encouragement you have been to others in your life.

God bless you in your endeavours.

Annual General Meeting

At this year's Annual General Meeting held in September, it was the final "make your mind up time" on whether to proceed with planning and fund-raising for a permanent third phase of the shop. It is a big financial commitment to make. Everyone needed to be sure that operating new premises - bigger than

the current portakabin – with continuing (and, hopefully, expanding) volunteer support, is a viable financial option for the village. I am delighted to report that the decision was indeed made to go ahead and the Management Committee can now continue planning in more detail and start seeking grants to support the project. Phase 3 can now start to become a reality...and not just a pipe-dream!

Funny Money

From talking to one or two villagers, it is clear that not everyone around here is aware that the Post Office part of the shop can also supply you with money. Cash can be withdrawn from the Post Office when it is open (see opening times below) and most bank cards are now accepted.

Also, if you prefer not to use cash for making your shop purchases, then you can use your card to pay. Like many shops, we make a small 50p charge on such sales under £10 and I'm afraid that the shop does not give cash back on these transactions.

Another quick reminder that our wonderful volunteers will try to help out in whatever way they can. So don't forget that, as well as meat, you can order other groceries at the shop or by phone and the staff will be pleased to help you out. Also, if you have problems in carrying your shopping home, we may be able to deliver it for you. Just ask one of our volunteers and we will try to arrange for it to be brought to your door.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 6th October 2015

Cllrs Joyce, Lewis-Davis, Mallyon (Chairman), Perry and Wills were present with Cllr Hawkins (DCC) and John Donaldson attending. Apologies were received from Cllrs Coe, Rake and Cllr Hicks (SHDC) and Steve Gale (Parish Clerk).

Report from County Councillor

Cllr Hawkins led a brief discussion on the condition of the bridge between Blackawton and Woodford. Highways have advised its structure is sound and the Parish Council agreed to lead efforts to fix it.

Changes at Ivy Lane Youth Club (including a new name and a new Chairman) were announced. Opening on two nights a week from next year was being considered and new Board Members were being sought. Groundworks for the new pool were now underway and an opening in September next year was expected.

Neighbourhood Planning

The Parish Council remained undecided as to whether or not it supports the development of local Neighbourhood Plan. Geoffrey Osborn will be asked to report on the process which is being adopted in Stoke Fleming.

Item for Consultation: Local NHS Services

John Donaldson updated the Council on proposed local developments in health services. It was hoped that final plans would be available for discussion in December and the Parish Council will continue to be kept informed so that Blackawton's views may be taken into account.

Finance

Bank balances stood at £41,060.77. Allowing for earmarked reserves of £29,408.26 and for payments due of £1,108.10, there remained £10,544.41 in unearmarked reserves.

The following payments were agreed and made:

- Chq 049: To HMRC for income tax deducted, £211.60,
- Chq 050: To Clerk for 3 months salary, £846.50

Request for Funding

A request for funding from Friends of Blackawton School was deferred until the next meeting.

A request from West Dart Bus for them to provide and locate a new noticeboard in the bus stop was approved.

Reports from Parish Councillors, Wardens and Police etc.

Cllr Lorien reported that incidents of vandalism had been discovered in the school playing field. It was agreed to ascertain if the school had reported these incidents to the Police.

Cllr Wills reported that the road sign on Quarry Road had been damaged.

Cllr Perry reported that dog mess had again been seen in the Play Park. Notices will be placed to try to help reduce this problem.

The tying of gates on the bridleway at Pruston Barton was reported.
