

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 1st September 2015

Notes only; for detail please refer to Blackawton Community Website: www.blackawtoncommunity.com. Cllrs, Coe, Joyce, Lewis-Davis, Mallyon (Chairman), Perry, Rake and Wills were present with Cllrs Hawkins (DCC), Hicks (SHDC), Phil Baker (SHDC Planning), Steve Gale (Parish Clerk) and 18 parishioners attending.

Open forum

Prior to the meeting, a parishioner voiced support for the production of a local Neighbourhood Plan and offered to be involved if any community-wide effort to produce such a plan was agreed.

The proposed development of another solar farm in the Parish was not supported locally and around 20 people had already registered an objection with the Planning Authority (South Hams).

Reports from district and county councillors

Cllr Hicks reported that most of the upheaval inevitable as part of changes to South Hams management arrangements had now been overcome.

Cllr Hawkins reported on the recent Dartmouth Regatta and the planned Dartmouth swimming pool.

Neighbourhood planning

Phil Baker of the South Hams Place & Strategy Team gave a helpful presentation on neighbourhood planning. This was followed by a question and answer session when many issues were raised mostly concerning the status of neighbourhood plans. Although these would carry the same weight as district plans and policies, they would have to comply with them so restricting the ability of local people to influence future development.

New planning applications

06/1725/15/F Oldstone Farm: solar farm. Following a vote it was agreed to recommend to South Hams that the application should be **rejected**.

06/1770/15/F Thisldo: extension. **Supported**.

06/1889/15/F Lower Clyston Farm: cattle shed. **Supported**.

Parish website

It was agreed that the community website had not been a success although the Facebook page had proved to be more used. It was agreed to re-launch the website with more councillors taking responsibility for its updating etc.

Community input into highway maintenance

Recent briefing material from Devon Highways was noted. Cllr Perry agreed to become the parish Snow Warden. It was agreed to invite Lisa Edmonds from Highways to a future meeting.

Finance

The bank balances currently stood at £34,548.05. Allowing for payments to be made and earmarked reserves of £25,928.26, a balance of £8,688.99 remained. A payment of £69.20 (including £11.53 VAT) was made to Martin Luck Group for stationery.

Reports from parish councillors

Issues on the quality and effectiveness of road maintenance and repairs. Details will be sent to Cllr Hawkins who agreed to investigate the issues.

Future meetings

It was confirmed that Cllr Bramble, Chairman of South Hams District Council, will attend the Parish Council Meeting to be held on 3rd November.

It was confirmed that the next Parish Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 6 October.

Clerk's Corner

Funds available for Local Projects

Are you involved with a local project which is struggling to get off the ground because of a lack of funds? If so, don't forget that the Parish Council has a small reserve kept back to support new community initiatives in the parish and it may be worth approaching the Council to see if there is any way in which it could help.

Also, between now and 18th December, application can be made to a fund set up by South Hams and Devon County Councils. The minimum grant available is £100 but there is no maximum limit. The money must be spent on one-off costs and preference will go to projects which provide a service to more than one parish. Proposals must have the support of the Parish Council and I have all the details of the scheme. If you may be interested in applying for such a grant, please give me a ring or email me and I'll let you know precisely what is involved and try to answer any questions which you may have.

Trimming Roadside Hedges

Now that autumn has officially arrived it might be a good time to remind landowners and occupiers that they are required to: trim hedges and trees so growth does not obscure road signs and maintains visibility for road users; trim hedges that directly abut a road, footway, cycleway or public right of way; remove dead or decaying trees and other growth that may fall across the highway; remove branches and other growth that may prevent the passage of high-sided vehicles; ensure the highway, footway and drains are left clear of debris from the cutting operations.

On major roads, the County Council cuts hedges on the inside of bends and at junctions at the same time as cutting the grass verges. The County Council makes every effort to encourage owners and occupiers to cut their hedges, and will identify occupiers who neglect this work and remind them of their responsibilities. Where roadside growth is becoming a problem, the County Council may serve a notice on the owner/occupier requiring the necessary work to be completed. Further details are available from County Highways who have produced a leaflet "Roadside Hedge and Tree Management" which contains more detailed information.



Opportunity for crime victims to meet offenders

Anyone who's ever been the victim of a crime will know that it's not simply the immediate effects of the crime itself that are felt. The impact can last for days, months and years, and can affect people far beyond the immediate victims. There is now an opportunity for people who have been the victims of crime to access a restorative justice process that gives an opportunity to come face to face, or correspond, with the perpetrator, and to seek the closure they often need to be able to move on with their lives, by asking the questions that remain unanswered about the crime. Restorative justice creates opportunities for people

affected by crime, conflict, anti-social behaviour or the harmful actions of others to come together with the person responsible, and seek answers to their questions and explain the impact the incident had on them. The process helps everyone move on. It gives those who accept responsibility for the incident an insight into the impact of their behaviour, and creates opportunities to find ways in which they can make amends.

Everyone taking part will be supported throughout the process by one of the trained independent professionals located across Devon, who will meet with the parties involved to talk about what happened and the effect it had on them, and if both parties want to meet this will be arranged; or if not, an alternative can be found, such as a letter exchange or recorded meetings. If a meeting is possible, a suitable and neutral venue for this to take place will be found, and the professional will guide the meeting to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to have their say. Both parties can bring a friend, family member or advocate with them, and everyone involved will be part of the planning process. Restorative justice is funded by the Police and Crime Commissioner as part of his responsibilities for victims of crime.
