A local newspaper article, dated Friday 5th April 1985, indicates that the 2nd Blackawton International Festival of Wormcharming took place on Sunday 31st March of that year. It attracted 28 teams and 150 spectators! President of the festival, David Kelland, hinted that the venue for the next contest may change because it had grown too big for the beer garden at the Normandy Arms - but no mention was made of a possible date change. A well known fount of all knowledge in the village has informed me that Wormcharming was eventually moved to a later date after the event had been adversely affected by a seriously hard frost. But, like many things "Wormcharming", that's as likely to be as much fiction as fact!

## Booking the Village Hall

The easiest way to check availability and make a **provisional** booking of the Village Hall is to use the internet. There are two easy ways to check availability or make a provisional booking:

1. Enter <http://www.hallmaster.co.uk/ViewRoomDiary.aspx?roomId=81> in the address bar of your Internet browser and press 'Enter'.
2. Via Facebook ([www.facebook.com](http://www.facebook.com)); search for "Blackawton Village Hall" then click on 'Book Now'.

Either method should take you directly to the booking website. Use the 'Next >>' and '<<Previous' buttons to get to the month required then if the hall is not already booked click the '+' sign on the day you want then add the details for your event to create a provisional booking. You will receive an email within a couple of days with an invoice and a booking form, provisional bookings only become confirmed bookings after the deposit is paid which should be within 2 weeks of the invoice date. The above are the preferred methods for booking the hall but if you don't have internet access please phone 712159.

## Village Hall Furniture

If there are no bookings that need the VH furniture it can sometimes be borrowed in return for an agreed donation and deposit but **only by prior arrangement**. A member of the committee should be present both when the furniture is taken and returned. Donation and deposit must be paid before any furniture is removed from the hall. A list of who is on the VH committee, along with contact details, is posted on the notice board next to the main entrance door.

# Parish Council

## Notes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 5th September 2017

Notes only – minutes are posted on the noticeboard and at [www.blackawtoncommunity.com](http://www.blackawtoncommunity.com).

Cllrs Joyce, Perry and Coe were present, as were Cllr Hicks (South Hams District Council), Cllr Brazil (Devon County Council), A Thom (Clerk), and four members of the public. Apologies were received from Cllrs Rake, Mallyon and Lewis-Davis.

## Cemetery application for a burial

The application for a former Parishioner with family connections to the Parish to be given permission to be buried in the Blackawton Cemetery was approved. This is an unusual case because of the strength of the connections.

## Cemetery – safety

The final response to issues with grave digging safety was deferred to the October meeting of BPC. The grave digger will make improvements to try to ensure the open grave is completely boarded over in such a manner as to prevent any person falling into the grave. In the grave digger's professional view shoring is not necessary in Blackawton's soil. The Funeral Director Allwood of Totnes plans to purchase hydraulic shoring for use in Blackawton Cemetery. A length of 7 foot six inches was proposed and requires reply from BPC.

## Report from South Hams District Councillor

Cllr Hicks reported that there were two controversial issues being considered by SHDC: a proposal to borrow and invest to try to meet the funding deficit, and a proposed merger of SHDC with West Devon Borough Council. There is a series of public information meetings about the proposed merger and Council specific ones. The initial report on the proposed Joint Local Plan doesn't raise issues which is good news.

## Report from Devon County Councillor

Cllr Brazil reported that the roadworks at the Fallapitt turn have been completed. He noted that the Coleridge meeting of 10-12 Parish Councils takes place soon and historically included Blackawton.

- 1480/17/FUL Abbotscot Blackawton TQ9 7AF. READVERTISEMENT Retrospective application for the retention of outbuilding used for storage of animals, feed and machinery. **Conditional approval.**
- 0767/17/FUL Field at Sx 793 508 Woodford Blackawton TQ9 7AB. Construction of an agricultural/equestrian building. **Refusal.**
- 1941/17/FUL Broadley Farm Blackawton TQ9 7AJ: Provision of livestock building to serve existing dairy farm. **Conditional approval.**
- 1776/17/CLE Foxglove Barn Blackawton TQ9 7DG. Lawful Development Certificate for an existing conservatory. **Cert of Lawfulness (Existing) certified.**
- 2219/17/FUL Blackawton Community Field adjoining Village Hall Blackawton TQ9 7AY. Erection of 10 metre column and luminaire plus associated groundworks for the provision of lighting for emergency night landing of the Devon Air Ambulance helicopter. **Conditional approval.**

## Review of New Applications

- 2079/17/COU Oakleigh Cottage, Main Street, Blackawton, TQ9 7BG. Change of use of dwelling to community shop. **Support.** In reaching this view BPC took the following into account:
- There is no alternative location: the planning approval for the current site will not be extended again, extending the Village Hall was considered but is not feasible, and a search has not identified any alternative to the proposed location.
  - The proposed location is centrally located. It will attract increased custom from passers-by such as users of the school.
  - Car parking is improved. There are parking spaces immediately outside the property. The existing location is on a sharp bend without safe parking immediately outside it. Although the Village Hall parking can be used, in practice most customers do not do this.
- 2951/17/ARC Land At Sx 805 510 Town Farm Blackawton. Application for approval of details reserved by conditions 3, 6, 10-12, 14-18 & 20 of planning consent 06/0992/14/F. BPC has concerns about inclusion of street lightning and about proposed delivery times. Greater clarity is required on the application and the process. A meeting with the Planning Officer will be requested, to be followed by an extraordinary meeting if required.
- Yarn, 4a Smith Street, Dartmouth, TQ6 9QR. The application is for the sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises, Monday to Saturday from 09:00 to 23:00 and Sunday from 09:00

to 22:30. Non-standard timings: Dartmouth Regatta from 07:30 to 00:00, Dartmouth Music Festival from 07:30 to 00:00, Christmas Eve from 07:30 to 00:30 and New Year's Eve from 07:30 to 00:30. The premises is described as a bar/café/eatery. **No comment.**

## Consultations

- West Devon and South Hams proposal to form one council. Closes midnight Sunday 8 October 2017. BPC will form a view in its October meeting.
- Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy. Closes 30 September 2017. No comment.

## Double yellow lines

BPC discussed whether the imminent development of Town Farm means the requested lines are no longer needed due to the drop off area for the school being in place. It was agreed the lines should go ahead. They are not just for school users and the timeline for creation of the new school drop off area is uncertain.

- Citizens Advice South Hams and SHDC event for Private Landlords: new energy efficiency requirements and penalties. Thursday 7/9/17 Follaton House and 14/9/17 The Watermark Centre, Ivybridge. 2pm and 6pm on both days and expected to last 2 hours.

## Reports from Parish Councillors and Wardens

DCC staff carried out strimming on a public footpath just before the end of the prohibition. The farmer would have cut in the near future therefore this work was also not a good use of public funds. Cllr Brazil to investigate.

Reported potholes from Cotterbury to Bow Bridge remain. Cllr Brazil will investigate. These may be part of planned rural patching works.

Blackawton Primary School would still like the Parish Council to meet at the School. Its request for students to carry out maintenance on the War Memorial was approved with thanks.

The Clerk will review whether more details need to be redacted from documents posted on the website to meet Transparency Code obligations.

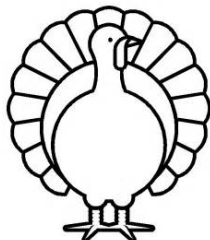
