
Wine Tasting Tuesday 27th June

Sycamore

from Bob Harvey, tree warden

Sycamore leaves are dark at first, as can now be seen by the dark areas in newly leafed-up hedges, but turn lighter later. It is a much maligned tree as it is so prolific in its regeneration and shades out competition in

hedges. Fast growing, as can be seen from the hedge on the North side of the road just past Hutcherleigh Turn, it quickly absorbs more carbon than conifers. The timber is currently of little value so it is often planted by foresters as a sacrificial tree to tempt the grey squirrels away from more valuable broadleaves, but it quickly produces firewood and it burns well, while it is magnificent when mature.

At the May meeting of Blackawton Parish Council it was resolved to support the 20's Plenty for Us campaign. 20's Plenty for Us is a small non-profit organisation campaigning for a speed limit of 20 mph to be normal on residential streets and in town and village centres, on the basis that communities can decide that '20's plenty for us'. The campaign includes over 600 local groups around the world campaigning for 20 mph or 30 km/h speed limits in their communities.



Your Parish Council believes that a 20 mph limit in the village would be in the best interest of our community - and that 20's Plenty for Us can provide us with useful information and resources to help us achieve this aim.

However, before we take any further action, we need to determine that it is not just the view of the Parish Council but one which is also supported by the community at large. To this end, a more comprehensive community survey may follow. But, for now, we invite all parishioners to provide an initial response, whether for or against. The Thoughts of Chairman Rake

Many thanks and filling gaps

I was delighted and honoured to be elected as District Councillor for the Blackawton & Stoke Fleming ward on 4 May. I hope you won't mind if I spend a short moment on District rather than Parish matters.

First, I would like to thank Helen Reeve, who served as our District Councillor for the past four years. I have worked closely with Helen over that time and her commitment and dedication, good sense and humour set a high standard for me to follow. Thankfully, District Councillors are rarely politicians in the usual sense of the term. Rather they are people who are willing to put their heads above the parapet in the hope that by doing so they will help make their communities, and thus the district as a whole, a better place to live. This was certainly true of Helen, so many thanks for her service.

Secondly, I would like to thank everyone who voted in the elections. Turnout in our ward was 44%, which was better than average. With the requirement to produce ID making things a little more complicated and with national elections looming on the horizon, now might be a good time to consider applying for a postal vote if you want to make it easier to vote next time around.

Lastly (I promise), I would like to thank the people I talked to when making my rounds for taking the time and (in many but not all cases) for words of encouragement and support. Much as I like walking around our villages and hamlets, it can be a long old slog trying to contact as many people as possible, but a friendly word or even a polite 'no thanks' can make all the difference.

Turning back to Parish matters now, things are a deal less rosy. Only four members of the previous Council stood again, with Alan Mallyon, Robin Mewes and Sol Curry all standing down. All three departing councillors made valuable contributions to the Parish Council over varying periods, and I would like to thank them for their considerable contributions, thoughtfulness and care for the Parish. They will be missed. Although it feels unfair to single any of the three out for special thanks, I am going to anyway. Alan was the longest serving, and was the Chair of the Parish Council for several years. His experience, fair-

mindedness and kind guidance were invaluable to the Council and particularly to me personally when I took on the role of Chairman.

So far, we have filled one of the vacancies by co-opting Charli Mardon—welcome Charli—with two spots still to be filled. I know that people worry that becoming a Parish Councillor will take up a lot of their time, but there is considerable flexibility in the role. Really, it is what a new Councillor wants to make of it. So if you have any inclination at all to find out more, please do contact me or any of my fellow Councillors for an informal chat about what is involved, and more importantly how you could get involved.

We also have a vacancy for a Snow Warden. There are many people across the Parish who will help if the weather turns snowy, so the Snow Warden's main role is co-ordinating this effort to try to keep us connected to the outside world when the weather turns nasty. Again, please get in touch if you think you could help out here.

Talking of filling gaps, we will need to do something about the avenue of cherry trees in the Churchyard. These mature trees are nearing (or have reached) the end of their lives and we will have to decide how to manage this. One option would be to fell them all at the same time and replant (with more cherries or other species). This approach has been recommended by at least one of the arborists who has come to have a look at them. Another possibility would be to fell only the weakest and replant one by one. Over the summer we will consult more widely (keep an eye on the website, or for information in the Shop and on the noticeboard), but as ever, if you have views or ideas on how we should manage this, please do get in touch.

Present: Parish & South Hams District Councillor Rake (Chair), Parish Cllrs Coe, Oughton, and Thomas were present, as was Devon County Cllr Brazil (for his report), A Thom (Clerk), and one member of the public during the AMPC.

Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

Election of Chair

It was resolved unanimously to re-elect Cllr Rake as Chair.

Election of Vice-Chair

It was resolved unanimously to elect Cllr Oughton as Vice-Chair.

Ordinary Meetings of the Parish Council

It was agreed that ordinary meetings of the full council will continue to take place in the Village Hall at 7.30 pm on the first Tuesday of each month except August, unless that Tuesday follows a Public Holiday, in which case the meeting will be moved to the following Tuesday.

Appointments to Special Areas of Responsibility

The current appointments for a Footpath Warden (Cllr Coe) and a Tree Warden (member of the public) were confirmed. It was agreed to suspend the Health Representative role. BPC is seeking a new Snow Warden.

Delegations of Authority

It was resolved to approve the updated Delegations document.

BPC Standing Orders

It was resolved to approve updated Standing Orders which include a new Model Standing Order covering financial controls and procurement.

BPC Financial Regulations

The Regulations approved 4/10/22 and that there are no later Model Regulations were noted.

BPC Asset Register

The Asset Register as at 31/03/23 was noted

Confirmation of arrangements for insurance cover in respect of all insurable risks

The three year agreement which ends 3/5/26 was noted.

Review of the Council's Subscriptions to other bodies

The Risk Register was noted. Cllr Rake will work with other Cllrs to convey how to test memorials for safety. BPC will seek a new Snow Warden.

Ordinary Meeting of Blackawton Parish Council

Co-option to fill vacancies for Parish Councillors

It was resolved to co-opt Charlotte Mardon as a Blackawton Parish Councillor. Cllr Mardon signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office. There are two remaining vacancies.

Report from Devon County Council Councillor

Councillor Brazil reported that not a lot has been happening because of the pre-election period. £9 million of extra funds has been made available by the Government for pothole repairs. A Highways engineer has said that £180 million would be required to bring the roads up to specifications. The DCC Neighbourhood Officer will be consulted about the state of repair of the road in Abbotsleigh.

Report from South Hams District Council Councillor

Councillor Rake reported that he is delighted to have been elected as Blackawton's South Hams District Councillor and thanked the previous SHDC Councillor for her hard work. He said the majority Liberal Democrat Council will be working with all SHDC Councillors to deliver the Liberal Democrat manifesto which includes housing and environmental objectives.

A decision regarding whether to write to ask Blackawton's MP to take action to make storm event overflows illegal was deferred.

20's Plenty for Devon Campaign

It was resolved to formally decide to support this campaign and for a statement of support to be in the next Beacon. A decision regarding whether to spend funds on promotional materials will be an item on the 6 June Agenda.

French Furze - Transfer of the ownership of the 'School Land'

It was noted that a meeting was held by Vistry with DCC, SHDC, and BPC in April 2023. Vistry plans to submit a section 73 planning application to address all outstanding issues. A site meeting, follow-up report, and two month follow up meeting were planned by Vistry. Cllr Rake will, in his role as SHDC Cllr, follow up issues including the unsecured and unfinished playground and an unsafe footpath in common area accessible to the public.

The quotes requested by BPC for the removal of three trees in the Cemetery and two options for the avenue cherry trees in the Churchyard (either doing the advisory work as listed in the tree survey or to fell and replant with fruiting cherries) were discussed. The option of planting other fruit trees was raised. The permission of the Diocese and of the Planning Authority would be required for work to the cherry trees. It also remains to review BPC's responsibility for the maintenance of the Churchyard. BPC would plan to carry out a community consultation prior to deciding on works to trees in the Churchyard. This will be an item on the 6 June Agenda.

Churchyard Wall Repair Quote

The School has reported a problem with the wall, and a quote obtained by BPC for the repair of the area reported as well as other sections of the wall. It was resolved to accept the quote of £588.50 and the £50 charge for the repairs to be separated in time, and to make arrangements for the work to be done as soon as possible.

Clerk's Core Hours Allocation

It was resolved to increase the core hours by 2 hours per week with a review in six months along with the Performance Appraisal, with the cost funded by vire from the sick leave reserve.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on **Tuesday 6th June 2023** at 7.30 pm. You are most welcome to join the meeting and to raise any issues which may be of concern to you.


